Our first full week back seems to have flown!

It's great to see the classes back into full swing, forest school was a big hit with class 1 and 2 yesterday (moved to a Thursday from a Tuesday), everyone has been enjoying some story time in our new, wonderful library space, and music lessons with IROCK and Mrs Wragg also began.

This afternoon, it was great to see so many of you join us for a celebration assembly, please check the calendar for other opportunities to come along, usually fortnightly. A reminder that we are keen to share and celebrate awards, certificates, trophies and mentions related to activities the children take part in outside of school. These will only be presented in a Friday assembly.

The UK government's guidance for the 2025 school year emphasises improving <u>attendance</u>, with parents expected to ensure children attend regularly, and schools and local authorities having clear responsibilities to identify and support pupils with attendance issues. If your child(ren) are absent from school, please contact the school office by 9am (a message can be left on the answering machine), alternatively, you can email the office, clearly stating the reason for absence. The "48 hour rule" requires a child to stay home from school for **48 hours (two days) after their last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting**. This policy helps prevent the spread of infectious illnesses in school settings. If your child vomits or has diarrhoea at school, they must be collected and cannot return for at least 48 hours after their final episode.

All requests for an extended period of time out of school must be made in writing (email included) to me at least 4 weeks before. Holiday requests will be deemed as unauthorised and a referral for a penalty notice may be considered and enforced.

In addition to the attendance information, please do ensure your child(ren) arrive to school on time. Children can start their day quite unsettled when they are late to school, and often feel self-conscious about walking into the class much later than their friends.

Thank you for your cooperation.

The weather continues to be up and down, please make sure a coat is brought into school so your child(ren) can go outside if it is not raining too heavily.

REMINDERS/NOTICES

- Please ensure you drive down School Lane towards school, slowly, there are quite often children and their families walking down the road to school too.
- Is my child too ill for school? NHS (www.nhs.uk)
- Please use the office email <u>office.3302@bishop-carpenter.oxon.sch.uk</u> should you need to make any enquiries, I will ensure they are addressed as appropriate. This email address is checked by me, daily. I respectfully request that emails are not sent to staff after 7pm during the week or over the weekend, unless it is an urgent query/update. Most email accounts allow you to 'schedule' send emails rather than send instantly.
- Parking 1 the playground is priority parking for class 1 and 2 parents in the afternoon, also disabled drivers and the taxi.
- Parking 2 When parking in the village at drop off and pick up, please ensure you are not blocking driveways (including either side of gateways) and not using grass verges. There is additional parking along the road further up the village and it's just a short walk down. Please avoid arriving at school too early as this also blocks the road and residents can't get off their drives, gates will open at 3pm.
- It is lovely to meet your 'furry' friends but I politely insist that dogs are not brought (walked) onto the school site. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

- Punctuality Our school doors open at 8.30am and our learning day begins at 8.45am. We have a lot to pack into our day and week, and want all of our children to start at the same time. We are unable to start our RWI phonics programme (delivered Mon-Thurs) until all children are in school, so please make a positive effort to arrive punctually in the morning. Similarly at the end of the day, pick up time is 3.10pm, there are an increasing number of families arriving late (sometimes unavoidably), often past 3.20pm. Staff also have things to do, places to be at the of their working day and have sometimes been delayed. Thank you for your support and cooperation.
- Water bottles We have a small supply of paper cups for children to use when they require a drink of water.
 Please ensure your child comes to school equipped with a water bottle every day. Keeping hydrated is vital for their health and well-being, having a water bottle encourages good habits. Thank you.
- Just a gentle reminder that a Healthy snack can be included for your child to have at breaktime, this should
 not include sweets, chocolate, pepperami sticks, this also applies to packed lunches, in terms of aiming for a
 balance of healthy choices. There are some suggestions on this website: Healthier Families NHS. We do provide a fruit/veg snack for KS1 children for their afternoon break, we are
 also a nut free school.
- Parking Parking on the playground can look quite chaotic at the end of the day. If you are in a rush, it may
 also mean that you are not fully concentrating, creating a risk of not noticing if a child/adult pedestrian is
 around. Please be mindful of making a sensible choice of where to park, this includes when parking in the
 village. Thank you.
- Please do not allow children to go onto the field and on the equipment after school at pick up time. There
 are many cars on the playground and often children are running off the bank straight onto the car park,
 without looking. Thank you.
